Awards for the best poster and oral presentations will be given to the young researchers as per IABMS guidelines. Few travel awards shall also be given to the deserving students and young faculty members as per IABMS guidelines.



AWARDS INSTITUTED BY IABMS - 2024

IABMS has instituted 19 awards and prizes under different categories. Those who would like to apply for the following awards must be an annual or life member of the association. All the papers must be accompanied by a duly filled in declaration form (Format is enclosed). The manuscripts for the prize papers should be in Microsoft format (Times new roman, font size 12) and submitted (soft and hard copies) to "The **General Secretary IABMS, F - Block F - 199, 1st Street, Anna Nagar East, Chennai – 600 102 on or before 30th September 2024**.

LIST OF AWARDS AND PRIZES - INSTITUTED BY IABMS*

- M K NAMBIAR MEMORIAL ORATION AWARD for an eminent scientist. This
 award is to be given to an outstanding scientist in Medical and Allied fields in a
 year and to a scientist of another faculty in the succeeding year. The Executive
 committee will select the awardee each year.
- Dr. E. BALAKRISHNAN MEMORIAL AWARD the best research paper in ophthalmology for scientists below the age of 45 Years.
- Mrs. THANGAM VASUDEVAN AWARD for the best research paper in any aspect of Biomedical Sciences, for Scientists below the age of 45 years.
- INDRA VASUDEVAN AWARD for the best research paper on Prevention/Cure or any other aspect of Cancer. If no paper is available on Cancer, it is left to the discretion of the Committee to give the award to any other good research paper. Upper age limit is 45 years.
- SIRI RESEARCH AWARD for the best paper on any aspect of Stress. Upper age limit for this prize is 45 years.
- Dr. YELLAPRAGADA SUBBAROW MEMORIAL AWARD for the best paper published in 'Biomedicine' during the previous one year. The selection will be made by the nominee of the Donor. Hence, no separate entry for this prize need to be submitted.
- PROF N PADMANABHAN MEMORIAL AWARD for the best paper in physiology comprising the work carried out in any departments of physiology by a postgraduate student of physiology.
- **THE PGIBMS AWARD** for the best oral-presentation of an original paper in any field of Biomedicine in the PGIBMS award session by a full time PG Student/Research scholar. The paper must be accompanied by a certificate from the Head of the Department to establish the bonafideness of the contestant. Papers submitted by regular teaching faculty of a department and those above the age of 35 years are not eligible for this award. No paper will be accepted for PGIBMS award session if submitted at the venue of the conference.

AWARDS INSTITUTED BY IABMS - 2024

- Dr. P S LALITHA AWARD for the best research paper by a professional undergraduate, who may be an undergraduate of Veterinary or any other professional course excluding Medicine. The research paper must contain the student's original work and the student should be the first author. Review articles will not be considered for this award. In any year if there is many eligible candidates two of them will be selected for the award by a selection panel, appointed by the Executive Committee of IABMS.
- Dr. LEELA KRISHNAMURTI MEMORIAL AWARD for the best paper by any Medical undergraduate Papers submitted will be evaluated by a peer group for short-listing a minimum of three contestants for presentation at the Annual conference. The selected three candidates will be adjudged at the Annual Conference by a panel of Judges appointed from among the experts attending the Conference and two prizes will be awarded.
- Dr. BRAMMAIAH SASTRI MEMORIAL AWARD for Biomedical Scientists of Eminence with proven academic and research contribution with not less than 25 years of professional standing. Eligible persons are to be nominated by a life member of IABMS/Peer Academicians. Self- Nominations will not be entertained. The nominations are to be made on a plain paper with full address and designation of the proposer and the Nominee. The proposal should have the consent letter of the nominee and his/her full biodata and overall contribution made by him/her. The nominations will be scrutinized by the Executive Committee / Subcommittee and the final decision will be taken by the Executive Committee. The selected Scientist for this award will receive a Medal and a Scroll. If no nomination is received for in a particular year, the Executive Committee can itself spell out a suitable person for the award.
- AGATHIYAR AWARD The award will be given to the best research paper in any branch of Indigenous medicine such as Ayurveda, Unani and Siddha except homeopathy.
- Dr. C R KRISHNAMURTHY MEMORIAL AWARD This award is for a Biomedical scientist of eminence in the field of Environmental Toxicology/Environmental Biology with proven academic and research contribution and with not less than 25 years of professional standing. Eligible persons are to be nominated by a life member of IABMS/Peer academicians. Nomination should be accompanied by consent letter and the biodata of the nominee.



AWARDS INSTITUTED BY IABMS - 2024

- Mr. V V SWAMINATHAN DIAMOND JUBILEE RESEARCH ENDOWMENT AWARD

 This Award will be given to an eminent scientist who has done an outstanding contribution in the scientific evaluation of medical properties of plants. The eligibility for the award will be a minimum period of 20 years of research-cumteaching experience in the evaluation of medicinal plants for their therapeutic use. Eligible persons are to be nominated by two life members of IABMS/ academicians. Nomination should be accompanied by consent letter and biodata of the nominee.
- Dr. A NAMASIVAYAM AWARD This award is exclusively meant for mid-level scientist (above 40 years) for his/ her original work done in the respective speciality in Indian basic medical sciences. An expert committee formed by the donor department namely "Dept. of Physiology, PGIBMS" will evaluate the received papers and the decision of the committee is final.
- Dr. M S KRISHNAMOORTHY AWARD The award will be given to a scientist (no limit in age) who has contributed original research output to develop a new research methodology in the discipline of Pharmacology and Environmental toxicology. An expert committee consisting of Pharmacologists and Toxicologists nominated by executive committee will select the awardee.
- PROF SUNDARAM SUBRAMANIAM ORATION AWARD The Award is exclusively meant for an eminent scientist above 50 years of age in any branch of Medical Sciences who is a life member of IABMS. A peer committee constituted by the executive committee of IABMS in consultation with the donor will select the awardee.

Mangala Devi Temple

Located 3 km from Mangaluru Railway Station in the Bolara locality, Mangaladevi Temple is dedicated to Goddess Mangala Devi, the namesake of Mangaluru. Built in the 9th century, it holds historical significance and is renowned for its Navarathri festival. It is particularly visited by unmarried girls seeking a suitable groom.

Kudroli Temple

Kudroli Temple, 2.5 km from Mangaluru Railway Station, is a prominent Hindu temple dedicated to Gokarnanatheswara, a form of Lord Shiva. Founded in 1912 by H. Koragappa under Narayana Guru's guidance, it features a marble Shiva Linga and hosts the grand Navarathri festival, similar to Mysore Dasara.





Kadri Manjunatha Temple

Kadri Temple, 4 km from Mangaluru Railway Station, is renowned for its 10th-century origins and 14th-century stone structure. Dedicated to Sri Manjunatha, a form of Lord Shiva, it features a 1.6m bronze statue with three faces and six arms. The temple is known for its natural spring and the Lakshadeepotsava festival.





Sri Durga Parameshwari Temple Kateel

The Sri Durga Parameshwari Temple in Kateel is a revered shrine located on an islet in the Nandini River. Known for its spiritual significance, it is accessible via road from Mulki Railway Station. The temple is located 28.8 km away from Mangaluru Central Railway Station and 17.1 km away from Mangaluru Airport.

Polali Rajarajeshwari Temple

The Polali Rajarajeshwari Temple, situated in Polali, 18.8 km away from Mangaluru, is dedicated to Shri Rajarajeshwari. Built in the 8th century AD by King Suratha, the temple has been expanded and enhanced by various dynasties that ruled the region.





St. Aloysius Chapel

St. Aloysius Chapel, or the chapel of St. Aloysius College, is a Catholic chapel in Mangaluru, 1.5 km away from Mangaluru Central Railway Station. The Chapel is situated in the heart of the city on the Lighthouse Hill. It was constructed by Jesuit Missionaries in 1880.

Ullal Darga

Located 9 km from Mangaluru Railway Station, Ullal is renowned for the Durgah of Saint Syed Mohammad Sherifulla Madani. The Ullal Jamma Masjid is a key pilgrimage site. The saint, who arrived from Medina in 1569, aided the poor with his spiritual powers. The tomb, built by Vittarasa Vodeya, attracts thousands for the Urus festival held every five years.





Karkala Gomatheshwara Statue

Located just 56km from Mangaluru, the Gomatheshwara Temple features a remarkable 40-foot-tall Jain statue. Dating back to the 15th century, this monolithic statue is carved from a single block of stone and stands majestically on a hilltop.

Dharmasthala Temple

The distance from Mangaluru to Dharmasthala is 74 km, and the journey by bus takes about 2 hours. The Shri Kshetra Dharmasthala temple, a significant religious site in India, is over 800 years old. The chief deity, Manjunatheshwara, also known as Dharmasthala Manjunatha, is worshipped in the form of a Shivalinga. This sacred shrine has established Dharmasthala as an important spiritual destination, revered for its holiness and history.





Kukke Subramanya Temple

The Kukke Subrahmanya Temple, located 108 km from Mangaluru, is a renowned, 700 years old Hindu temple in Karnataka, India. It is dedicated to Lord Kartikeya, revered as the lord of serpents, and offers a serene and peaceful experience for visitors.





Kollur Mookambika Temple

Located at 128 km away from Mangaluru, in Kollur, Udupi District, Karnataka, the Mookambika Devi Temple is dedicated to the Mother Goddess, a union of Adipara Shakthi and Parabramha. It is one of the 108 Durgalayas and 108 Shilyavasa, established by Adi Shankaracharya and part of Parashurama's seven abodes of Salvation. The temple is believed to be 1200 year old.

Udupi Sri Krishna Temple

Located 57 km from Mangaluru, Sri Krishna Temple in Udupi, Karnataka, is a significant Hindu pilgrimage site in South India, built in the 13th century. Thousands of devotees visit this temple town to offer prayers to Lord Krishna.





Gokarna Murudeshwara Temple

Murudeshwar, 156 km from Mangaluru, is famous for its Shiva statue, while Gokarna is known for its beach trails. In Honnavar, calm your mind with a walk through beautiful woods and green mangrove trees, or enjoy a boat ride, perfect for a calming experience. The temple is believed to be built in the 16th century.





Saavira Kambada Basadi

The Saavira Kambada Basadi, or Thousand Pillars Temple, is 34 km from Mangaluru Junction and 25 km from Mangaluru International Airport. Known for its unique design with non-identical pillars, this 15th-century Jain temple is a key pilgrimage site in Moodubidri, often called the "Jain Varanasi" of South India

Kudupu Anantha Padmanabha

Kudupu Anantha Padmanabha Temple, located 8.8 km away from Mangaluru Central Railway Station, renowned for its dedication to Lord Vishnu. The temple's intricate architecture and serene atmosphere attract devotees seeking spiritual solace. Known for its vibrant festivals and rituals, it holds a significant place in the local community's religious and cultural life.
